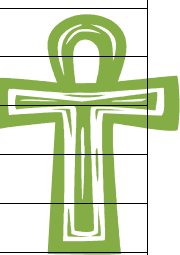

Ordinary Time is a season of the Christian liturgical calendar, in particular the calendar of the Roman rite and related liturgical rites.

The English name is intended to translate the Latin term Tempus per annum (literally "time through the year"). Ordinary Time comprises the two periods — one following Epiphany (feast or season), the other following Pentecost — which do not fall under the strong seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, or Easter.

The weeks in ordinary time are numbered, although several Sundays are named for the feast they commemorate, such as Trinity Sunday (first Sunday after Pentecost) and the Feast of Christ the King (last Sunday in OT), and, in some places, the Feast of Corpus Christi (second Sunday after Pentecost).

The liturgical color normally assigned to Ordinary Time is green.

Food For Thought: Today's feast is the oldest celebration of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the Roman Catholic Church. While the new beginning celebrated by New Year's Day may take precedence in the mind of most people, today's feast is wrapped up in the Roman concept of an octave, that is, the eighth day, which is a symbol of fulfillment or completion. January 1 rounds out the celebration of Christmas with its emphasis on the divine becoming human. The Word of God could only take on our human nature through the cooperation of the Virgin Mother. Her yes made the birth of Christ a reality.

January 1 ♀ Mary, Mother of God ♀ Luke 2:16-21

At the instruction of the angels, the shepherds went to Bethlehem to see Mary, Joseph, and the infant. After their visit, they made known the message they were given about the child, and all that heard were amazed. When the child was eight days old, he was named Jesus, just as the angel had instructed.

Imagine an angel talking to you! How do you think you would react? If you knew what the shepherds knew about the infant, how would you spread the news? If angels told you to do something that seemed a bit unusual, how would you react? An angel told Mary to name her child Jesus. How did your parents decide what to name you?

Looking ahead! Our Archbishop has recommended a program for use during Lent. It is called "Living the Eucharist". It is a parish based renewal experience that fosters growth and discipleship by promoting full conscious and active participation in the Eucharist. Parishioners take part in different ways: joining adult and teen small groups, engaging in family activities, as examples. There will be more on this in early January when we begin to formally promote it.—Join Us!
